The Tokyo Culture Creation Project Enters 4th Year and a New Stage

Toward Making Tokyo a Global Culture Creation City TOKYO CREATIVE WEEK to be Held October 20 - 30

The Tokyo Culture Creation Project has undertaken many projects in order to make Tokyo a global culture creation city, and has entered the fourth year since its launch in 2008. To achieve its goal, an even greater leadership role will be assumed.

Just as has been done in undertaking projects in the three categories of "Festival", "Kids" and "Artpoint", arrangements have been made anew for the four categories of "Festival", "Kids and Youth", "Artpoint" and "Networking". Tokyo creative culture will be disseminated to the world more than before, and measures for forming an international network will be strengthened.

■TOKYO CREATIVE WEEK

This year the Tokyo Culture Creation Project will again undertake a variety of projects throughout the year. To further increase the Project's ability to communicate its message, 11 days from October 20 to 30 have been designated as TOKYO CREATIVE WEEK, during which each undertaking can be intensively experienced. A program for inviting culture related individuals from abroad will also be implemented. It will be a time when Tokyo culture can be fully taken in and can be powerfully communicated domestically and abroad.

■This year's theme: TOKYO FUTURE SKETCH

The Project designated this year's theme to be "TOKYO FUTURE SKETCH" — Draw the future with the power of our culture, with the aim of sending a message about what Japan and Tokyo can do for the recovery from the Great East Japan Earthquake, presenting it as sketches drawn in a sketchbook. The Project will put all its effort into tackling this theme and sketching out Japan's future.

In particular, special programs will be undertaken that directly takes on this theme at TOKYO CREATIVE WEEK. FUTURE SKETCH Tokyo Conference will be an international conference held for considering what kind of future can be sketched out through culture. With the artist Katsuhiko Hibino acting as a supervisor, the FUTURE SKETCH BOOK Program will also be undertaken, where the future imagined by the people gathered in Tokyo will be drawn in a special sketchbook. These drawings of the future will also have an effect on discussions at the international conference.

The Tokyo Culture Creation Project undertakes a variety of programs throughout the year. However, this year a period has been designated to intensively experience each of the projects, and increase the Project's ability of communication and networking. <Overview>

The Project will put all its effort into tackling this year's theme, TOKYO FUTURE SKETCH, in particular, this special program will be undertaken which directly takes on this theme in preparation for TOKYO CREATIVE WEEK.

<Details>

 FUTURE SKETCH Tokyo Conference October 28 (Fri.) to 29 (Sat.) [The Japan Foundation Sakura Hall and other locations]

An international conference will be held including the participants in the International Visitors Program. Following the Great East Japan Earthquake, the creativity and power of culture and the arts will be re-examined, the new shape of society and the future will be searched out, and proposals for a model for the structure of a new creative society will be made.

FUTURE SKETCH BOOK From August [Various areas in Tokyo] (tentative)

With the artist Katsuhiko Hibino acting as supervisor, workshops and other events will be held where people gathered in Tokyo will consider, "Draw the future with the power of our culture," and will sketch out the future in a special sketchbook. The future that's drawn there will be presented far and wide domestically and abroad, and will have an effect on discussions at the international conference.
