

Tokyo Culture Creation Project "Kids/Youth" programs -offering outstanding cultural experiences to children, the cultural leaders of the future

Tokyo Culture Creation Project, organized by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government and the Tokyo Metropolitan Foundation for History and Culture in cooperation with arts organizations and NPOs, aims to establish Tokyo as a city of global cultural creativity. The following projects, centered around "Kids/Youth" programs - one of the pillars of Tokyo Culture Creation Project - will be held in February and March.

Performance Kids Tokyo - enhancing children's physical awareness

Performance Kids Tokyo is a program in which artists in the fields of dance and theater will be sent to schools and cultural facilities to conduct workshops and create original theatrical works, with children taking the leading roles. This year the program will be held in 12 schools and 8 other locations including performing arts halls.

In March, the completed performance will be held as the final workshop of 2014-15 to be conducted in a performing arts hall. "DETARAME Carnival" will be created, together with children, by dancer/choreographer Maki Tabata, who is active both inside and outside Japan; and performed with live music accompaniment by "Bakurocho Band" on March 1 (Sun.) at Mitaka City Public Hall. In addition, famous rakugo stories like "Jugem," "Manju Kowai" and "Sakurambo" will become dances in "Chin Ton Shan Beben! Rakuraku Dancing with Rakugo," created along with elementary school children by choreographer/producer/dancer and young "Condors" dance company member Takuro Suzuki, and performed at Akasaka Civic Center on March 29 (Sun.).

Artist: Maki Tabata

Maki Tabata is the director of co.Taba-Maki. She started creating her own works in 2007, and works extensively inside and outside Japan. In recent years she has been giving workshops for people of all ages, with the aim of promoting physical expression that everyone can enjoy regardless of differences in gender, age or experience. She has been a registered artist with the Public Hall Contemporary Dance Activation Project in the 2013-14 and 2015-16 terms.

With the aim of stimulating musical culture and promoting creativity, the music festival "Music Weeks in TOKYO 2014" presents a variety of projects - based on the key concepts "participation" and "creativity" - which could only take place in an international music city like Tokyo. In cooperation with participating artists as well as pioneers of educational advancement projects in other country, "Music Weeks in TOKYO 2014" develops a diverse range of projects including participatory workshops; training programs for workshop leaders and artists central to those workshops; and support for artistic activities.

• International project in cooperation with the Portuguese musical facility Casa da Música

Through workshops, this project aims to foster self-expression and communication skills and enrich the human spirit, while raising awareness of music and the arts. This year as last year, it will be held in cooperation with Portugal's Casa da Música, which has been gaining attention for its high-quality education programs. We will hold a "Workshop Leader Training Program" for artists, teachers and students, inviting Casa da Música's education program coordinator and workshop leaders. In addition, from February 5 (Thu.) to 8 (Sun.) we will present the "Casa da Música Original Workshop" and "Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Original Workshop," which can be enjoyed by everyone from infants to grownups.

"Traditional Performing Arts for Kids" public performances - Presenting the results of a training program with leading performers

In the program "Tokyo Traditional Arts Program - Traditional Performing Arts for Kids," children will receive instruction directly from leading performers in the traditional arts of *Nohgaku* (*utai*/chant, *shimai*/dance, *kyogen*/comic drama, *hayashi*/instrumental accompaniment), *Nagauta* (*shamisen*, *hayashi*), *Sankyoku* (*koto*, *shakuhachi*), and *Nihon buyo* (Japanese traditional dance), over a several-month period. At the end they will present the results of their training in public performances. The aim of the program is to give children a deeper understanding of Japan's treasured cultural traditions and inherit the spirit of these traditions.

This year a special youth course and a step-up course for past participants are being offered for the first time. Currently, about 300 children are taking part in 17 courses in the 4 fields. The public performances will be held next March at Hosho Nohgakudo and Asakusa Public Hall.
